MINUTES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

Held at Elkhart, Ind. Nov. 29, 1915

Meeting called to order by the Chairman, C.Z. Yoder.

The secretary led in prayer.

The following members were present: C.Z. Yoder,

D.D. Miller, J.S. Shoemaker, G.L. Bender, and D.S. Yoder.

On motion Bro. D.H. Bender (who was present) was accorded full membership privileges of the meeting.

Minutes of previous meetings were read and on motion of D.D. Miller were accepted as read.

On motion it was decided that the house and lot owned by the Board in Youngstown, O., be disposed of, and that \$3000 of the invested funds be transferred to apply on the Youngstown Mission debt.

On motion the brethren C.Z. Yoder, D.D. Miller, and G.L. Bender were appointed as a committee to act conjointly with Sister Clara Steiner to make investigation relative to Women's work in the Church.

On motion it was decided to reconsider the action taken by the Executive Committee relative to Bro. J.N. Kaufman and family returning to India at the end of their furlough.

After due consideration it was decided to rescind the former decision relative to the Kaufman's returning to India at the end of their furlough.

On motion the secretary was instructed to give the

Financial Agent a copy of all such resolutions passed which effect his work.

On motion the Financial Agent was authorized to investigate the feasibility of disposing of the Mission Home in Gashen, and securing another location for the Home.

In considering the appeal coming from India relative to sending two single sister to India at once, it was decided that we do not see our way clear to send two sisters at this time since sister Florence Coopriker and a trained Nurse are to be sent out a little later on.

Since the Board has no money to loan to cover the indebtedness on the Nampa Mission, it was decided that the property be turned back to the original owners provided satisfactory arrangements can be made to make said transaction.

On motion it was decided that sister Ella Smucker be stationed at the Canton Mission provided she passes the necessary examination.

On motion it was decided that sister Minnie Campbell be stationed at the Kansas City Mission, on condition that she passes the necessary examination.

On motion it was decided that sister Phoebe Yeackley be appointed as a worker at the Gospel Mission, Chicago, provided she pass the examination required of mission workers.

On motion it was decided that the Local Board of Canton, O. Mission be given the privilege to make arrangements for the erection of a new church building at Canton not to exceed \$5000 in cost.

On motion the meeting adjourned to convene at the call of the Chairman.
